RW: I know that this is not an easy question, but what makes good magic?

JG: Boy, where do you start there? Well, you want to have something that gets a positive reaction from the audience. Something that puts a little smile on their face, something to hold their attention. It's always the music, the lights, the movement, it's everything. You know you're using the basic elements of illusion there. It's not just one thing. It's everything kind of moving together.

RW: So it's a complete experience?

JG: Yes. I mean even the costuming, the way they handle themselves. And any one of those little things can be an irritant, put the audience off a little bit.

RW: What's the place of amateurs or hobbyists in magic, and their responsibilities?

JG: Well, you hit on the key word, Responsibility. Everyone started out as an amateur. Its just that the responsibility is in the magic organizations, in your friends, and the magic shops. It's up to the IBM the SAMs, rather than encouraging mediocre magic, rather than giving the trophy every time and all that,... even the Magic Castle, they've got to be up front and honest and give constructive criticism to these people. Don't let the same stuff go on. There's so many people that we all know out there that are doing... You look at it and you say, "Gosh, don't they listen to anyone?" Well, maybe it's that no one's telling them. So I think we all, as amateurs or professionals, we all have a responsibility to help the others along. And too, the amateurs, they should listen. You know, don't be fooled by doing it in front of a mirror. I used to do birthday parties, when I got started out. I was a wonderful performer and my little sister used to say "you know, you're not foolin' anyone." and she would always grab the deck of cards or she says "do it like this."

RW: Did you listen to her?

JG: Yeah! I mean, of course she devastated me, and she was right. Well, you see, if you're a piano player, ya gotta be able to do that. If you go out in front of an audience and you can't play the piano, Bang! They pick it up right away. Unfortunately, in magic, there are some props that help carry along the amateur a little further than you wanna be. So, ok, they can do the svengali deck, they can fool you with that, then they go to something they can't quite do too well.

RW: They outreach themselves?

Yeah, very quickly, and they're already hooked on that reaction, that feedback. Well hell, I just experienced it. You know, I was a star. Oh! I would open the curtain and all these people applauding and smiling at me... and loving me. Then, the very next day I go to see the next show that comes in and I'm sitting there in the audience and these people don't know me. It's like you get this false sense of elation and you feed off of it. And me, as an amateur performer, it's very easy for me to say "my god, what a weird thing!" You know, it's there, but it's really not there. That's what you gotta be able to pick up on while you're performing. You got to constantly reevaluate what you're doing.

RW: But that can be painful.

JG: Yeah.
