#### **BOARD MEETING**

The April Board meeting for Ring 76 was again held at Sherry Luft's home, with Don Soul, Rick Waterhouse, Dick Bush, Mark Flores, Greg Wauson, Dick Dale and Julie Dale in attendance.

Rick started the meeting by addressing some of the concerns that were raised previously about the direction that the present board was heading, whether or not the club has been a successful organization, and what may be done to insure that the club continues to improve. It was generally agreed that the present club has improved inasmuch as it has attempted to offer its members more opportunity to practice the Art of Magic and transcend from a passive role to an active role in the club's functions.

Rick stated that although the new meeting location is favored by most of the club's members, there are still concerns about its remoteness. He suggested that those members who have voiced complaints about the location could help secure a more central site.

Julie reported that only a small portion of the club's regular members paid their dues at the April meeting. The club benefits from everyone paying their dues on time as well as submitting their information form as provided in the previous newsletter. 
