New Members



The whole performance was done by Victoria Chaplin (Charlie's daughter) and her husband Jean Baptiste Thierrie. They wrote, directed, staged, selected the music, and made their own costumes. It was fantastic!

Victoria, a clone of her mother, Oona, was agile, graceful, a fine gymnast, a beautiful dancer and a wonderful mime.

Jean -Baptiste could walk on the stage and make you laugh. His forte was funny wigs, outrageous clothes, a "putty face", silliness, suitcases galore—which held all sorts of surprises - and MAGIC!

Our favorite magic was the sawingin-half. The table is rolled out - the box removed and the lady (Victoria) was placed on the table. The box is replaced and the steel blades shown, then forced through the box and the woman. Then the middle section is removed. Jean Baptiste is so thrilled with this section of the box, he brings it to the front of the stage - turning it around and showing her middle through a small door. Upon returning to the table he starts to replace the middle section. A blank look crosses his face. At once the audience realizes that he doesn't remember which way it belongs! After moments of frustration, he sets the middle portion on top of the illusion and rolls the table off - exit stage left!! Next trick!

The Reviews

Daryl's Video: Volume 8 The Great White Rope \$29.95

Brad Burt's latest advertising newsletter talked highly about several videos. But, if your budget only has one video in it, you've got to make a choice. For me two weeks ago it came down to one of Michael Ammar's new money videos or a Daryl rope video. Brad gave the nod to Daryl, since rope magic can play to a small or big audience (and also because the video runs two hours). With some reticence I took his advice.

For many years I have mostly shied away from rope magic; too often rope magic moves are too evident or, even it they aren't, the effect itself isn't very strong or just may not appear magical, My opinion started to change otherwise when I witnessed Tabare's brilliant (and very magical) rope routine at the 1994 Desert Magic Seminar in Las Vegas. Also influential was David Williamson's ring on rope routine on his Dave II video. And now Daryl's video has convinced me ... rope magic can entertain and have a mind-boggling impact on an audience.

Daryl's video is a winner for several reasons. Daryl's fresh and enthusiastic presentation is a key. Also, his handling of the rope is natural and he offers useful suggestions for making the most from each effect. Darvl has good teaching skills and uses red and white ropes to make the moves understandable. This particular video is volume eight (the third of Daryl's three rope videos), featuring ring and rope effects, various knots and miscellaneous items. Especially good are his eight-minute rope routine including the strongest and most convincing presentation of the Professor's Nightmare I have ever seen. And if you're not fooled by the Jumping Knot of Pakistan you are more on the ball than I am. Also good are almost all the "ring on rope" items. Daryl explains it all in detail

I learned many new moves and plan to incorporate several into my performing repertoire. A few final thoughts: the audio and video quality are excellent, the tape lasts a full two hours, at \$29.95 the price is right and, oh yes, the fireplace in the background gives it a warm, cozy ambiance. Don't pass this up.

Greg Wilson's Double Take The Video on Double Lifts \$29.95



With over two hours of material. seven strong routines and over twenty-five different double lifts, this video is probably the definitive work on the subject. The double lift has been called the most misused sleight in magic. Greg Wilson takes us stepby-step through several get-ready procedures, double-lifts, and replacements. By breaking the move down into its base components, Greg allows us to practice the sleight in manageable chunks, and eventually create our own double lift creations.

This video coupled with a few hours of practice will have you dou ble-lifting your heart out. In fact, that might be the danger. After watching this tape and practicing its contents, you will be tempted to work a double into everything you do. Regardless, this tape is worth every cent. Buy it if you want to polish up your double, or review the techniques of Wilson, Vernon, Marlo, Nash, and others.

10 minutes with David Costi by Rick Waterhouse

The Las Vegas Desert Magic Seminar has long attracted attendees from all over the world. This year, we were given the opportunity to listen to a man named David Costi. David began with a ten minute monologue that was truly a Seminar highlight. Mr. Costi graciously allowed me to excerpt parts of his video tape chat.

When you read these words, try to see the man in your minds eye. Picture a modest Italian gentleman whose voice ranges from the soft melodies of a poet to the impassioned fire of an evangelical zealot as his hands punctuate his ideas. If you can try to see the man, as you read his words, then you may experience some small percentage of the charming impact shared by those in his lecture hall.

First, I apologize because English is not my first language. I hope that I can make myself understood fairly well. When asked to do this lecture, I started thinking about what to do, what to show. And very honestly, I said "I shall be taking a risk". The risk is that this room might empty itself in the next ten minutes. For one very simple reason. I think that most of us know at least 200 effects. If we really sit down and think about it. I think that most of us know at least, really, 200 effects. So I said to myself, "what good would it be, to bring maybe two or three of four new effects"? We will all be knowing 204 effects. Correct or no? But what's the use of it ... If we cannot take the maximum out of the 200 that we already know? If we really can not take out of it the maximum of the five of the 200 that we know? So, for those of you who are expecting me to surprise you, I think that you will be very much disappointed... because I am still learning magic myself. So I don't repute myself at such a degree as to be able to teach.


So that's not my aim. But, very egotistically, I should say that my aim will be to put forward the philosophies and the way of thinking of teachers that I had the honor and the opportunity to follow.


If we really analyze magic, we see that 99.9% of the time, something is lacking, something is missing. It is not going through. Why? We all read the theories. We all know the theories. Misdirection: "Oh, you look that way, and..." Very theoretical. I consider... I am not a professional magician. I do not make a living off of this. I Love Magic. I'm here because I love it. I love sitting with people, doing magic, learning magic. Magic is an Art. But remember always, that there is no art without culture.

Unfortunately, very often, what is lacking in our art, is culture. Everything makes up culture, everything. From our backgrounds, from our interests, from our daily life, from what we study in magic, this helps to build up our culture. Are not our effects that have to value us, but us who have to value, give value Levant said, "The magician must be better, to our effects. than his trick". And he's CORRECT! The magician must be better than his trick. Oth erwise anyone could just










RICK WATERHOUSE GREG WAUSON JIM JOLLY JIM FRY DICK BUSH SHERRY LUFT MARK FLORES

walk into a magic dealer, buy ten ffects and just do them. But you will have a lot of things lacking.

What I mean is, we must, if we really love magic, if we really want to upgrade it to the level of Art with a capital A, sit down and analyze it. And once we have analyzed it, analyze it again. Really, how many of us, when they read a book where a trick is excellent, have really thought of how the structure of the trick is built to achieve the effect? Why is such-and-such effect in the hands of so-and-so a miracle? And we buy it, \$50.00, and tomorrow I'll do it. Fantastic. And in our hand sits just another trick. Why?

Have we really thought, structuring our routines about the timing, the pose, the misdirection. The misdirection is not just the glance, it's the voice. We can not learn

sdirection. Misdirection must be fitted on us like a tailored suit. It

must be part of our normal way of acting otherwise it will be just an artifice. So, this is why, I was very much in doubt of what to do here tonight. I brought some effects. I don't want to call them tricks for a reason. I don't want to diminish them, to bring them down to the status of tricks. When someone says "Show us a trick!" Well, this is not the way. I would never lower myself to perform for somebody that would say "Do us a trick". Because, the trick I am doing ... is a piece of ART! It cost me sacrifice. It cost me time. It cost me work. It cost me study. So, I want people to respect my effect, not my trick, my effect. What I am going to show them. This is what we have always to bear in mind. That we are not selling peanuts. Even if many of us are not professionals, but wouldn't it be good to feel that you are transmitting an emotion. If you get through to your public and you transmit an emotion, you make them

laugh, you make them cry, you make them think, then you are transmitting emotion. And only THEN, you are achieving something! When somebody reads poetry, or a ballet dancer dances, or somebody sings, they are transmitting something. The skin has, I don't know how you call them, goose pimples. And you are receiving something. And you know that it's only fiction, that they are on a stage, that it isn't true, and that afterward they will go out and have a pizza, or whatever, but in that precise moment they are transmitting you an emotion. These people are giving us something. THEY are artists.

So, this is a little bit my way of thinking. It's not my own. It's been transmitted to me. I'm studying on it, but honestly it is the road that I will pursue even if I will not find consensus because it is what I feel.
