New Meeting Location



Scott's **Thoughts**

The Approach

Have you ever approached someone to entertain them with magic only to be told that they were not interested in seeing your tricks? Is it your style, your manner of approaching them, your timing, your appearance, or perhaps the unwilling volunteer him/herself? It could be any of these things or a combination of them. It could even be something unrelated to you that is beyond your control.

Several of these things can be controlled by you; however, some factors are controlled by the emotions and previous expenences of the spectators. For example, they may have religious reasons for not wanting to watch you. They may be engaged in a deep personal or business conversation. Perhaps the unwilling spectator is having a bad day and just wants to be left alone. Or they have had a great day and they want to share it with someone rather than taking the time to watch your performance just now. They may ask you to come back again later, so remember to return to these guests as they have requested. Be conscientious of those you plan to approach and try to quickly ascertain if they would be amenable to watching your performance.

You will come across people who just don't like magic and feel threatened by your very presence. Asking them to select a card may be a mistake unless you plan to restore the card that

Ring Report

January's meeting may have been the last one at El Cajon's Hungry Hunter but it was a lively kick off to the new year. Many members and friends showed up for Small Packet Tricks night -- faces we haven't seen in awhile. The meeting opened with Rick Waterhouse telling the members of his recent trip to the North County Meeting. One of the best he has been to in a long time, according to Rick. They have really changed the way they do things.

Leading off the Teach-In portion of the pre-meeting was Greg Wauson. Greg demonstrated the underground Elmsley count and described how this effect leaves a packet of cards immediately reset to be shown again. Greg explained how he uses this count in MacDonald's Aces. Joe Florian followed, explaining how a regular Elmsley count leaves the packet ready for a Jordan count, which will restore the packet, ready for another Elmsley.

Rick Waterhouse showed the Ascanio move he had picked up from last year's Michael Ammar Lecture, crediting Michael for his outstanding teaching ability. Gary Salisbury demonstrated and explained an Eugene Burger effect called "I Don't Believe This Effect." It truly was unbelievable. A face up card is sandwiched between two face down cards. With no moves whatsoever the face up card clearly goes from between the two face up cards to behind them. Gary even showed the effect in slow motion making it that much more, unbelievable. If Gary had not explained the effect to the totally engrossed group, many of us would have stayed up late many nights trying to figure it out.

Joe Florian explained the Monkey In The Middle effect before Rick demonstrated his skill and mastery of the Fandango

(APPROACH from page 2) they are about to tear up! Perhaps they have had a bad experience watching/helping another magician and they never want to see another magic trick for the rest of their lives. I am reminded of Pearl S. Buck who was asked by a magician if she would like to see a card trick. She said no, then he proceeded to show her 37 card tricks.

We can't always work at the Magic Castle, the Magic Island or one of the few other places where Magic is the main form of entertainment, where people intentionally go to see magic. Most of our performances are given in more ordinary venues like restaurants, picnics, cocktail parties, corporate banquets, Christmas parties, etc. where we are booked by someone who likes magic. But not all of the employees or guests may share that same feeling. Not everyone in attendance cares to see a magic show, I have had some people leave after dinner before I began my stage show. They had no idea what they were about to miss nor did they probably care until the next day when everyone talked about it at the office. When approaching people to show them some closeup magic, remember that they are reluctant volunteers at best. They don't want to be fooled or to be made a fool.

They may see someone approaching them who is dressed a little different, someone whom they don't know, someone who is obviously not the host. They are unsure how to react so they pretend that they don't see you. You are the outsider, the intruder into their sphere of familiarity.

Timing is important not only in your magic but also in your approach. You must treat them kindly and not force yourself on them. Wait for the right opportunity, a time when there is a break

in the conversation when they look at you and acknowledge your presence. This is your time to introduce yourself and try to get on their side. Remember, you are trying to get on their side, not trying to get them to come over to your side. You need to engage them in light conversation before trying to put a sponge ball into their hand. They need to know you and to know that you are not threatening but rather, you are a friend that is there to show them a good time for a few moments. People like to be entertained by friends. It's also harder to say no to a friend.

If you have tried this approach and you are still rejected. then shake it off and go on to the next table or group. Even professional athletes learn early on that you can't carry one bad play over into the next or you will dwell on that bad experience and cause you to louse up again. Concentrate on the positive and forget about the previous rejection. Every good magician gets rejected occasionally for reasons usually beyond his control. If you have done everything else right, your approach and your appearance is perfect, and they still don't want to see any magic, then just remember that it is not your problem but rather their loss. Go find someone who is ready to be entertained and to have a good time.

straightforward objectives:

- convenient for members

A Cure For the Common Conjurer

How much would you pay if you could enjoy the benefit of 29 years of performing experience in three short hours?

The ad in the

last issue of MagiCurrents said, "THIS IS NOT A LEC-TURE." It was a workshop designed to give attendees, "new ideas, more confidence in their performance, and the ability to structure an entertaining presentation." The ad also said, "\$40!" I called Dan Harlan and talked to him about the workshop. He told me what he intended to discuss and how he was purposely limiting attendance to 10 people. After he reminded me of the moneyback guarantee, I signed up.

Other Ring 76 members considered going but thought \$40 was, "too pricey." So when I arrived at Dan's hotel room I wondered how many others would finally show up. To my surprise...and eventual delight, I was the only student for the night!

Dan could easily have canceled due to lack of interest but he felt so strongly about the principles revealed in his workshop that he graciously accepted me as his lone pupil. I soon discovered \$40 was a bargain as my head filled with new ideas and new insights to what it means to be a magician. An unadvertised bonus was that dinner was included!

Dan Harlan is well known in magic circles. Amazingly creative, he invented Cardtoon and is considered the world's expert on rubber band magic. At 31 years young, he has been a performing

magician since he was 15 although he was on stage at the age of two. After spending 3 hours with this inspiring magician I understood why he is so highly touted as a superior teacher.

I've often heard at lectures or in magic instructional videos and books that we (as magicians) should not just copy the style or effects of others but should strive to put something of ourselves into our magic. It's a very common theme I'm sure you're familiar with. But so few professionals these days can tell you HOW to unlock your creativity or how to use your own experiences and personality to make an effect touch an audience emotionally.

Dan and I discussed creativity and how it resists structure. His skillful use of analogies and metaphors showed me how reallife experiences can relate to the magic we choose to present.

He showed me tools I can use to plan a performance; worksheets to help sort out my thoughts, how to categorize the effects I know how to do, and why some tricks work with certain audiences. We even discussed some of my favorite effects and how I could make them better.

Too quickly our time was up but I left Dan's room filled with possibilities. I felt fortunate indeed to be added to Dan Harlan's "group of masters" but sorry that other local magicians missed out on a great opportunity. Dan has given himself a year to do this workshop around the country. He may be through San Diego again and if you are a performing magician this workshop should be mandatory. If you are a hobbyist. then Dan's workshop will give you the confidence and skills you need to not just do tricks...but perform magic.

Move. David Lane demonstrated a snap-change and explained it's use and limitations in different settings. Gary Salisbury concluded the pre-meeting explaining the Darwin Ortiz Mexican Poker effect which he Gary had learned from Craig Stone --using the Jonah Card principle.

The business meeting touched on several issues including the recent light attendance at Ring meetings and the need to reverse the trend; club funds stand at approximately \$1,000; and class of membership within Ring 76 and how to get people to come to meetings. Scott Wells column in MagiCurrents was voted on by members in attendance and passed. This vote led to questions on how the Ring should handle issues when less then a quorum is attending a meeting. The Board will address this issue at the next Board meeting. Greg Wauson mentioned that T.C. Tahoe will be our guest lecturer in March and details should be firmed up shortly. Rick discussed the situation with the Hungry Hunter and the Ring's search for another meeting site. Jim Jolly, Gary Salisbury and Jim Fry are on the relocation committee. Gary mentioned that the Gathering in Old Town is a possibility. At the conclusion of the business meeting, the Ring presented Rick and Marcia, married just before Christmas, with a wedding gift. Rick also received his new magic wand -- a scrub brush.

The main meeting was focused on Packet Tricks. Joe Florian began with an effect called Will The Jacks Match? Joe dealt five face up and five face down cards from a deck onto the table. Spelling out the phrase Will The Jacks Match to match pairs of face up and face down cards, Joe selected people to choose when to start and when to finish. When the

effect concluded, Joe showed that the Jacks, and only the Jacks, did match. Then, in the blink of an eye, all the pairs turned into matching pairs. Joe's next effect was with a mental deck - dealing out □, +, ☆, ○ and ≈ cards, five face up, five face down. Joe had a spectator choose a face-up card and someone else choose a face down card. Remarkably they matched. Then all of the cards changed into the selected cards.

Joe followed with an effect that typifies magicians to many: It's all done with mirrors. Joe began with a small packet of cards. He shown the cards to be 6 different hearts which he promptly turned all of the cards into the 6♥. Joe explained, magicians can do this, because it's all done with mirrors. As Joe concluded he remarks he showed that the packet of cards. which had been 6 indifferent cards, then all 6 of hearts were now a packet of very shining. highly reflective mirrors. Nicely done Joe.

The evenings final effect had Marcia Ferree Waterhouse selected from the audience to perform a card cutting miracle. From a deck of cards, a red and a black ace were selected. Marcia was asked to cut the deck anywhere using the red ace. Then, using the black ace, to cut the remaining cards. It was then revealed that Marcia, having a free choice, had cut to the mates of each of the aces -- the red aces in one pack and the black aces in the other. Very nice effect.

After the meeting, several members milled around, discussing the end of an era. The Hungry Hunter had been a wonderful location in many ways for nearly a year and it was now at an end. Thanks for the memories, Hungry Hunter of El Cajon.

Board Report

The Ring 76 Board met at Jim Jolly's on Monday, January 22. This marks the first Board meeting that changes the date of Board meetings to the second Monday after a Ring meeting. Most Board members were present and voting. The Agenda for the meeting was: (1) Lectures; (2) Meeting Locations; (3) Cost Issues; (4) Advertising; (5) Themes through April; and (6) Rules on Ring Voting.

Greg Wauson reported that T.C. Tahoe has been contacted and will lecture for the Ring this year. The Board voted to move the T.C. Tahoe lecture from March to May, if possible, to better meet the needs of the Ring. Greg and Rick were assigned the task of finding an appropriate lecturer for the February meeting.

While Dan of the Gathering has offered the Ring a meeting place in his restaurant, it is not possible to meet there in February as the restaurant is in the process of moving across the street. Greg, Rick and Jim Fry were tasked with search other possible venues for February. We expect to be able to meet at the Gathering starting in March.

A member has raised a concern after the January meeting about payments for MagiCurrents publishing, without receipts. Jim Jolly reported that all payments had been for submitted receipts. Ring 76 only pays expenses for items turned in with receipts.

The issue of colored mastheads for MagiCurrents was raised. Ring 76 members are asked to vote at the next meeting if the club should pay approximately \$168 for 1,000 11"x17" colored masthead pages. This should serve the Ring for approximately the next year. Alternatively, MagiCur-

rents will continue to be B&W (as with this issue).

After a passing vote on paying for and carrying Scott Wells column in MagiCurrents at the January meeting, Dick Dale asked whether this issue (or any issue) can be voted on without full Ring membership present. The Bylaws were reviewed and a quorum is consider ten members, two of who must be Board members.

The Board adjourned at 9:10 p.m. Next Board meeting is at Dick Bush's on February 26 at 7.
