# **Ring 76 June Meeting**

After welcoming our many guests, the June meeting started off with a presentation by the nominating committee of candidates for the election of officers. Nominated were Gary Schwartzwald for president, Dick Dale for vice president of entertainment, Tom La Chance for vice president of membership, Don Soul for secretary, Julie Dale for treasurer, Ralph Mauzy for sergeant-at-arms and Paul Thomey for member-at-large. With no one else being nominated from the floor and nominees running unopposed, a motion from the floor was made to conduct the election without ballot slips and the motion was seconded. The election concluded with a unanimous verbal show of support by the attending members for the new officers.

Brief announcements were made then the long-awaited Stand-Up Performer of the Year contest began. Leading off was Bill Monroe who opened by producing a deck of cased cards. After removing them, the case disappeared then reappeared with only one card in the case. An audience member was

asked to name any card and, wouldn't you know, that card was pictured on the face (along with 51 others). Next Bill brought out a prediction in an envelope. Dribbling the deck, a spectator was instructed to yell "stop." Bill removed three cards at that point and repeated the process with two more spectators. He then placed the cards into three cups and, through the process of elimination by the audience, arrived at only one remaining card. The envelope was opened and the prediction matched the card selected. It was now time for Bill to borrow a five dollar bill from the audience. He tore a portion of the bill containing the serial number and gave it to a spectator to hold then placed the remainder into an envelope. Next, he performed "the vanishing, jumping flame" using a butane lighter which vanished. He followed this with the vanishing burnt cigarette. After all this, he truly vanished the five dollar bill by setting fire to the envelope! A spectator was asked if he had a pack of cigarettes. He opened them and inside was Bill's vanished lighter. 
# MAX HOWARD





was the original five dollar bill, proving it by reading the serial number which matched the mate.

Next up to entertain was Gabe Travers, toting along his famous treasure box of props. He offered some LifeSavers to the audience but only to someone who didn't like LifeSavers. The candy changed into gum. He followed by showing us Balloon in Tube but, unfortunately, the prop didn't work too well, even with the help of others from the audience. In spite of all his rehearsal, the darned thing refused to cooperate on stage. Needless to say, that item mostly likely will NOT return to his treasure box.

Our next performer was Jeff Smith and his lovely assistant, Sandy. Selecting nine-year-old visitor Nina from the audience. Jeff placed a catsup bottle into a bag and made it disappear then reappear. Next it was "you-do-as-I-do" with Jeff using the catsup bottle and Nina a root beer bottle with cover tubes. This was followed by borrowing a \$20 bill which he vanished then, handing the spectator a wallet with an envelope inside, had him open the envelope. He found 50 cents and I.O.U. Jeff borrowed a shiny ring from another person, made it disappear then gave her a small box. Inside was a quarter. She placed the coin into a prizecapsule machine which had been in sight the whole time then out came a capsule and inside was the first gentleman's \$20 bill. A second try at the machine produced a ring but it wasn't hers. One more quarter donated by Jeff allowed our guest to finally retrieve her ring from the prize machine.

The next performer was Paul Thomey. He took us on a magical trip to a wonderful dimension. What if all the generalities we've heard of about magicians were true; that we're all cheats? As a thief holding a gun, it would be easy to take your ring, your watch and your wallet. Paul said it's better for a magician to place all the valuables into an envelope, which he did by removing the items and placing them into a pay envelope. Set to music, he made the envelope disappear only to show us his ring, watch and money were all back where they belonged. For his next effect, a young guest was invited up to help Paul perform a "you-do-as-I-do" trick with ropes. Myron Joseph helped Paul next. Joe selected a card while Paul's back was turned then buried it in the deck. Paul "blindfolded" the deck and, after having a bit of "trouble" locating the card, displayed a bottle of club soda. Joe was asked to name his card and Paul turned the bottle around showing the "8 of club soda", the very card selected.

Rounding out the evening was "The Amazing ShamanDon, Mystic Seer" (Don Soul) who entered wearing a bathrobe and glasses with fuzzy eyebrows, large nose and mustache. After taking a verbal jab at our newlyreelected president, he summoned the spirits to assist him. With the help of Gary Dismukes, he produced a bottle of Jack Daniels and proceeded to "communicate" with the spirits. A dollar bill was then folded by Myron Joseph and the Amazing ShamanDon made it disappear, never to be seen on the face of the earth again. Finally, he asked Sherry Luft to assist as he presented her with a zippered wallet. She assured the audience there was no way to load the wallet. (By this time, of course, ShamanDon was fullyloaded). Next Gabe Travers was brought up to shuffle a deck of playing cards. Lastly, Paul Thomey was summoned to select a card from Gabe's deck. All three spectators acknowledged that none of them knew they were going to be selected to assist. After Paul signed his card, he showed it to the audience and to Sherry to identify later. He buried it in the pack and Gabe shuffled then placed the cards back into the case. ShamanDon pointed out that normally magicians first bring out the deck then the wallet but (since he isn't normal) he did it in reverse, all without touching the props once they were given to the assistants. With a wave of his wand over the tabled cards and the wallet Sherry was holding, he had her unzip the wallet. Inside was one card. "Is that Paul Thomey's card?" ShamanDon asked. "Yes." "And is Paul Thomey's name on that card?" "Yes," again. Utterly astounding! No one threatened to attack the Amazing ShamanDon when Sherry revealed to the audience Paul's business card!
