Over the past year I have seen a variety of lectures through Ring 76, at the IBM Convention this summer and by independently sponsored lectures. Although I rarely 'perform' magic, I do listen to these lecturers with several points of view in mind. I try my best to think as a performer. I readily listen as a audience member, and most intently I listen as a presenter because I often do present to groups. It is interesting to me to compare the advice and ideas of a variety of lecturers. A few examples of what I heard follows. Hopefully my memory somewhat matches what the lecturers meant, or at least what they said.

When asked how to be successful and get booked to the shows you want to do Paul Green and Bob Markwood suggested only allow yourself to be booked for the type of shows you want to do at the fee you would like to be paid. If you don't want to be viewed as a children's magician, then don't do kids shows. On the other hand Jeff McBride said get booked doing anything you can including volunteer shows, just make sure you get publicity. McBride talked about the trickster and that we shouldn't present ourselves as having magical or mystical powers. Max Howard on the other hand expressed that we have made a great mistake and

done an injustice to ourselves by not convincing the public that we do have magical powers and of course we can read their minds. Please contact Rick Bruce for further details on this view. Yes, he knows who will call. There are many more successful magicians, lecturers and people who will give you contradictory advice.

Peter Pit once said something like find some honest people who will tell you the best parts of you as an entertainer and as a person and then put those traits forward as much as possible. Sort of a, go with your strengths, put your best foot forward, and to thy own self be true type of thing. This advice shouldn't be limited to performing and I do think this is probably some of the hardest advice to take because it is less of an act and takes quite a bit of internal honesty. Good luck.

Non-members may attend three Ring 76 meetings at no charge (except for special events)


Local dues are \$20 per year

Based on the enthusiasm of those involved with producing the show and the rewarding financial outcome for the Ring treasury (\$240!!!), it was agreed the Ring should pursue, perhaps, three or four of these events per year and leave the marketing up to Mike Stilwell, if he is so inclined. A Ring policy regarding payment, stage security during performances, etc. in the form of an agreement should be generated for Mike to use.

Meeting plans for October, November and December were discussed. **Jack White** has okayed use of his Magic Place for our pot-luck Christmas dinner. Future speakers for either Ring-sponsored lectures or the remaining free-to-members lecture were reviewed. Dick and Don will attempt to find quality magis.

Next, **Tom Kasner**'s bill for services during the previous administration was debated with the result

that he should receive reimbursement payment with regard to materials statements submitted to Julie to this point. The approximate total was \$35. Dick then moved on to announce he'd like someone to photograph the two publicity proclamations he's arranged near the middle of the month of October in honor of Magic Week. Ralph will attempt to offer support.

Officer's reports: Julie announced a treasury of \$696 and Tom stated a membership of 56. Gary would like to see that figure soar to 100 before the next election. Ralph requested that a new set of badges be fabricated, which he is willing to undertake, and the board agreed. Don was notified by Gary that **Greg Wauson** will publish the February issue of MagiCurrents since Don will be out of town during the editing and publication process.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned.
