## Ring 76 November Meeting

IThis month's pre-meeting consisted of Jeff Marcus conducting a rubber band teach-in. Because there are so many tricks out there involving rubber bands, thanks to Dan Harlan's wonderful instruction videos. Jeff concentrated on two: The Snap and band penetration through thumb held by a spectator. Useful, impromptu things when put on the spot to perform. Dick Dale then presented his pass-the-mat trick, a clever presentation where a shuffled deck of cards was cut into four piles, each pile mixed by two volunteers. One turned over the top card of one selected pile and Betty Armstrong opened a sealed envelope given to her by Dick before the meeting. The prediction matched the turned-up card! The mat was passed to Ralph Mauzy.

After Dick set the tone of the meeting theme - mental magic and mentalism - six member/performers proceeded to dazzle us. First up was Jeff "J.J." Smith who did a neat two-deck coincidence involving Betty then four people from the audience each peeked at a card in a deck tossed amongst them-

selves. Jeff named their four cards! Tom Kasner next gave us an absolutely fantastic thought transmission effect involving a briefcase containing a notepad. As one spectator then another inscribed a number or design on the pad concealed from Tom's view, Tom was able to perceive their thoughts. (Tom, was your electronic wizardry at work on this one?). Jeff Marcus took center stage and had Donna Soul assist as he called for single-digit numbers from three spectators. With those numbers, Donna mentally rearranged them, turned to a page in a common phone book and concentrated on a phone number. As difficult as it was, Jeff wrote down his perception, handed it to Sherry Luft then had Donna announce the phone number. It matched the sheet of paper Sherry was holding. (Gasp!)

Next, Loch David Crane, as Baffling Bill Cody, then related a story from Indian legend, using a deck of cards as an example. He had two spectators mix the deck thoroughly. Baffling Bill





## **Editorial Reply**

Last month's editorial commentary regarding the Masked Magician elicited the following response...

Last month's *MagiCurrents* had an article suggesting that exposure of magical secrets on television is not all that harmful and that we should just let it "run its course." I strongly disagree.

Many illusionists have had to spend thousands of dollars replacing tricks that have been exposed and they have spent countless hours practicing new tricks to replace them. Most Ring members do not do big illusions and therefore many of them do not realize the big problems TV's exposures have caused. Perhaps the problem is easier to understand if you think about what may happen in the future if TV exposures continue. As they become more commonplace, eventually <u>your</u> tricks will be exposed. Think about your favorite trick, one you have spent hours learning. When TV exposes that secret, perhaps you'll begin to understand the problem. Arguments that magicians should just adapt won't make you feel much better.

It's true that magicians are probably not yet losing bookings because of the exposures. That will come later, when the exposures are more commonplace.

So what should we do? Let the problem "run its course"? There is absolutely no reason to believe that will happen if producers feel no pressure to stop. Now that the snowball has begun rolling, exposures will continue on other networks. The Masked Magician is not the only one who is willing to sell out his trade. And it will begin to affect <u>us</u>, who don't do the big stuff.

W.A.M., the World Association of Magicians, has hired experts to help them. These experts understand what affects TV producers. Let's follow their advice. Write to some advertisers.

It is your hobby, or your profession, that may suffer if not enough magicians are willing to help.

took the deck then removed three prediction cards and placed them face down. A number was randomly supplied by Sumit Dua which was used by one spectator to count off that many cards into three piles. He then had the other spectator turnover the top cards of each pile and, wouldn't you know, its color mate had been selected by Loch. Dick Ustick, with his son, Alex, put on a display of great thought transmission using ancient coins. Each placed the coin on their foreheads. With Alex removed from the stage, Dick had someone come up and merely point to a display of a dozen cards on a placard.

Upon returning, Alex, with the help of dad's thoughts, knew exactly which card was selected. This was repeated one more time. Finally, Paul Thomey performed "Back From Lunch", emptying a paper bag of nine or ten decks, each rubber banded. Tossing out five of the decks, each member of the audience opened theirs, cut anywhere in the deck, removed a card and placed the remainder back into their cases and the cases back into Paul's paper bag. As each deck was removed - still banded - Paul perceived each spectator's cards, one by one, which they then displayed. (Hey, Paul, didn't you have a little help from Larry Becker on this one?) What an excellent routine for Out Of Body and what a delightful evening of entertainment.

Next, a discussion of lecturers for the April meeting was examined which include the possibilities of Whit Hadyn, Peter Pit and Kevin James. Dick will contact those magicians for availability. Also, Daryl's millennium lecture tour will be scheduled for August. Daryl promises all-new material. This will be a Ring 76 fund-raiser and Daryl is more than happy to appear.

Don was given the Ring One policy manual on diskette, as obtained by Dick Dale, and he will modify it in time for the April board meeting to reflect Ring 76. Ralph then announced he is making progress on creating new badges via the computer and will present several layouts to the board, also in April.

Tom handed out membership phone lists to each board member for them to call and finalize who will bring what to the Christmas party and get a head count. This information will be given to Don who will notify Jack White to prepare the meeting place. He will also contact Julie with the head count so that she can round up beverages, paper plates, etc. The board will supply a turkey and ham.

The performing platform situation was next on the agenda. **Tom Kasner** has decided to buy back the platform and will issue a check for \$200 to Don, who, in turn, will reimburse the Ring 76 treasury.

It was agreed that there will be no board meeting in December. Don announced he will not be in town in January during the time for publication of *MagiCurrents* and Gary received assurances from **Greg Wauson** that Greg will take over editor chores during that time to put out the February issue.
