President Gary Schwartzwald revealed the mystery of the invisible bouncing ball catch in paper bag and taught coin thru hank. Gary Dismukes' favorite trick is one in which a panel of the president's portrait is cut on three sides and held by a spectator. He then folds the remainder of the bill, unfolds it and the bill has flipped sides. Visitor and IBM member Bryan McDaniel took center stage to show us his favorite trick. He explained it was the very first trick he ever tried to learn...one called Paul Harris' Reset. Ouch! Mastering that trick for starters is a feat in itself. His presentation was excellent. Let's hope he becomes a member of the Ring real soon. Paul Thomey returned for the third time this evening as he borrowed a deck of cards, had one signed and returned to the deck by visitor Al Vasquez, then observed how much pain Al could withstand as he fanned a lighter under

I's hand which held the deck of cards. While Al bravely succeeded, Paul then showed Al's signed card, and no other,

had been burned approximately one-third of its surface. Our last performer was Jeff Marcus who flawlessly manipulated three pieces of rope, each a different length, and made them all the same length. Membership in the IBM international organization is required. IBM dues are \$40 the first year. You will then receive "The Linking Ring" magazine, one of magic's best publications.


Prospective members are required to perform a five-minute magic
