## Board Meeting

The May board meeting was held at Dick and Julie Dale's house. Attending were Ralph Mauzy, Gary Schwartzwald. Tom La Chance and Don Soul. The meeting was mostly devoted to final planning of the installation banquet. It was agreed that admission will be \$15 for any person 15 years of age or older and a rate of \$1 per year of child under 15 years of age. Because the Ring must make a commitment to Ranch Catering for the number of people attending so as to prepare enough food, the only admittance into the installation banquet will be by reserved, advanced ticket sales only. Tom will make up a notice regarding the event for publication in the June newsletter.

Dick confirmed that the La Mesa American Legion Hall "big room" will be the location and Gary next assigned tasks to organize the banquet. Ranch Catering will set up and tear down the tables provided by the Legion Hall. This will include tablecloths and plasticware but not deco-

rations. The performer (and lecturer the following evening) will be Sylvester the Jester, a crowd-of-all-ages pleaser. The order of events will be the same as last year and Don will create the program hand-outs. Ralph will create the Close-up and Stand-up certificates for all who participated and Julie will purchase the plaques for all categories of awards.

Gary sought approval for a brief opening act before bringing out Sylvester and it was unanimously approved by the board. The performance will remain the board's secret. Julie Dale will create survey forms, based on last year's format, which will be issued as guests enter the banquet hall. Such forms proved useful last time.

The subject then turned to the logistics for officers election at the June meeting. It was agreed that only paid-in-full members would be allowed to vote on the evening of June 14th. Tom reported that currently there are 63 paid members with




