
what those madcapped magicians of southern California are up to. So basically in one election, I have gone from an unknown to the voice of my generation (magically speaking).

Recent talks in the Internet chat rooms have brought up the subject of "Women in Magic." The question being, "where are they?" Yes, we have women in our Ring, and yes, we have all seen female magicians perform. However in a time when women have made inroads in all other aspects of life, why aren't there more women in magic? The pat answers, that it is an "Old Boys Club," women are actively excluded, there is not enough out reach to young girls, etc. may have held water twenty-five years ago, but today, I don't think that is the case. If it is not the problem, what is? I decided to talk with a woman who had posted her concerns on this subject.

Margaret LeClair is a professional magician known as Margaretta A. Magician.

She reports a lifelong love of magic (but who hasn't?). She has been performing

professionally as a magician for about two years, and left a career in construction to pursue one in magic. Ms. LeClair performs all types of magic, but is concentrating efforts on becoming an escape artist. She is a member of IBM and IBM Ring 29 (the host ring for the recent IBM Convention),

as well as the Fellowship of Christian Magicians.

It is her opinion that the general public has a difficult time accepting a female magician.

"Now, what do you think that did to my self esteem?", she asked me.

Margaret went on to say that she accepted the party, and went in with the attitude that I'll show them female magicians are every bit as good as male magicians. By attitude, she did not mean that she went in there with a chip on her shoulder and an "I'll show you!" attitude. Margaret told me she

show you!" attitude. Margaret told me she meant that she would do her best to inform them on the competence of female magicians.

"But," Margaret went on to say, " I do run into this all the time, people assuming I'm a clown. I have to reaffirm the fact that I'm a MAGICIAN, not a CLOWN. If they insist on a clown, I refer them to someone else, although I hate to lose out on the business."

While the talk was active that day, Margaret was the only woman who responded. The Internet is democratic but not always representative. The problem was not solved there nor will all the answers be found here. It is an issue worth discussing though, and I would like to hear from our membership on this or any other topic of importance.
