In Response To: HELP! Kid Show Coming Up (Alan)

If you must do these shows, here is some advice.

Learn a warmup to get some energy out of the kids and weld them together as an audience before the magic begins.

- 1. Easy to find books with real help in them: kid's chapter in Hay's Amateur Magician's Handbook, 1982 or 1996 edition Doing Magic for Youngsters by Easley and Wilson
- 2. You need some apparatus magic for color and flash. Make your own Square

- 7. Get a breakaway fan and a drooping magic wand, and use them as running gags on yourself! The kids will love it. The "adult in trouble" bit will work for you again and again.
- **8.** Choose tricks that need assistants, such as Coin in Ball of Wool. Encourage active vocal response. No trick should work without the kids shouting your chosen magic word; in fact, you should have some that fail until you remember to have them shout the word. Have the kids jump up and down, wiggle, etc., to get some tricks to work. Look surprised yourself, or even relieved at times, that the magic worked! Kids love to have you 12. Egg bag goes over great! It was found that the wand could often be used to tip the cups over, poke inside magic props, etc., to prove them empty

without sneaky fingers getting into the act.

This certainly didn't replace palming, but as you probably know, with the cups and many other magical effects, a "clean" move will be done once to set the tone, and then all kinds of "dirty" methods can be employed, the public thinking the method must be the same throughout the effect.

My own experience, much to my constant amazement, is that many members of the public still believe the wand has some sort of power. I suppose a lot of that comes from them having no idea whatsoever what it is for. Plus, currently, few if any other practitioners of anything use them. But many times when someone has asked to see my wand, which comes up frequently, and I have offered it for them to hold, they take a step back, and say they just wanted to "see" it.

> In days long past druids, shamans, priests, etc., incorporated tree branches,

> The wand is a powerful tool, even tho most often it is simply a stick used to point and wave. One should never underestimate it's power, and handle it as if it were indeed magical.

Oct.21, Hans Klok, Magic for Millennium bones, stones, and such, into rituals, calling into play nature gods, spirits etc. kings and figures of authority or great knowledge all had some sort of stick or staff symbolizing their power. magicians were members of the court, and considered among the intelligentsia at the time, they had these symbols as well. In Exodus, when Moses wanted to show the power of God, he tossed his staff on the floor where it changed into a shake. To show the power of their gods, the Egyptian priests repeated the effect with The power of the staff was their staffs. firmly established.

> When magic started taking its place as entertainment, the large, unwieldy, staff was replaced by a more manageable symbol of authority, the wand.
