It was nice to see Brad Burt in the audience and again taking part in the meeting and magic activity. Nearly 40 members paid their dues for the coming year. Those not paying will be sent bills for their dues in the next month.

The auctioneer for the evening was Jack White who is known for moving things along. He had 21 lots of magic to auction off that included nearly 60 preowned videotapes featuring some of the top names in magic. Some of the tapes were performance only and others with various lectures.

Many individual members brought some very nice props and effects that they no longer used. One seller told MagiCurrents that they made a lot more




Above one of the prize auction items that went for \$45 a foot locker filled with magic props and silks. This was a highlight of the auction.

lot of them including at least a half dozen 6-foot square colorful production silks that went for a fraction of their true value

According to Ring 76 treasurer Richard Ustick this was one of our most successful auctions. Several items were donated to the Ring so we received all of the money from the sale of those items. All of the other items auctioned at the Ring received a flat 10% percent of the hammer price. At one point J.P. Jackson and Jack White demonstrated a very funny routine with Rice's Haunted Chimney. It is a large set of production tubes that hold a huge load of silks. There was also a little magic mixed in with the auction.

In addition to Richard Ustick, Sherry Luft and Diane Lane kept track of the sales and made the check out process very smooth. All of the business of the evening was wrapped up by 9:15.p.m.

Sad news department: Ventriloguist-Actor Paul Winchell, is dead at 82. Winchell debuted his vent act on TV with dummy Jerry Mahoney in 1947 on the NBC Television Network. Winchell began a show business career as a teenager doing a vent act first in 1936, he appeared on the Major Bowes Original Amateur Hour on radio winning first prize. He also appeared on a string of children's shows on television that included such guest stars as Carol Burnnett, Lucille Ball and Angela Lansbury. In the 1970s he became the voice of "Tigger" in the "Winnie the Pooh" features for Disney. Born Paul Wilchen in New York City on Dec 21, 1922, he was a shy youth who stuttered. Facinated with ventriloguist Edgar Bergan, Winchell learned to throw his voice and gradually overcame his speech impediments. He was one of the greats.

Ring 76 member *Kenny Shelton* was a contestant in the close-up contest at the I.B.M. Convention in Reno in early July. While Kenny did not win any of the top prizes he had the experience of taking part in a major magic contest. He says he is already making plans for the contest next year in Florida. Kenny also took part with performer *Ron London* in the Hospital shows in Reno.
