

Imagine you are the Wizard of Mind reading. You call on someone and state that you can read their mind if allowed to ask a few simple "yes/no/ sometimes/I don't know" questions. The person can think of an animal, vegetable, mineral or any

object. After the interrogation, you tell them exactly what they were thinking of and it works every time!

For a birthday present I received a toy from a family member; it cost \$15.95 and is called "20Q" – short for Twenty Questions. This silly electronic toy fits in the palm of your hand or it could be concealed under the table and glance at it while you're "concentrating" With four main buttons as listed above it also has a back-lit liquid crystal screen that scrolls the questions at whatever speed you desire.

I have stumped it about three times out of 30 but that may be because I answered a question or two incorrectly. However, it is uncannily correct. If it guesses wrong after 20 questions, it'll ask five more and it usually hits. For instance, I thought of "beet" and after 20 questions the machine guessed "turnip." 
