Honors for Bob Elliott at the annual Installation & Awards Banquet, deemed a success by members

More than 100 Ring 76 members and their guests turned out for the Installation and Awards Banquet for the "Honest Sid Gerhard Ring" in San Diego. The event was held Sunday afternoon, July 22^{nd,} at the Cottonwood Country Club, in El Cajon, a community just east of San Diego.

Those attending began arriving at 5 p.m. and enjoyed cocktails and appetizers with a buffet Mexican meal served at 6 p.m. During the cocktail hour there was a lot of close-up magic at the various tables. The banquet was held in a giant tent on the 18th green of the country club. Several members of the Ring played an afternoon round of golf before the banquet began.

During dinner a special announcement was made that someone was on the telephone for one of our guests. The caller was David Copperfield, who was between shows and was calling to congratulate Bob Elliott on his Special Award of Distinction from Ring 76. Copperfield could be heard via speakerphone and thanked Bob for all of his kindness during his 20 years with the Tannen Jubilee and the Tannen Summer Magic Camp. Copperfield made it clear he was a personal fan of Bob Elliott's.

The Elliotts moved to the Southern California beach community of Oceanside in 2005, and Bob has been active in San Diego County magic groups since his arrival. His impact on the local magic scene and his past contributions to magic on the east coast prompted the Ring 76 Board of Directors to initiate this Special Award of Distinction to be given to Bob Elliott. Ring 76 board member Michael E. Johnson began calling on Bob's many friends and former magic students for help and everyone Michael talked to wanted to be part of this event to honor Bob.

California Governor, Arnold Schwarzenegger, a magic enthusiast, sent a special written congratulations, members of the U.S. Senate and the Congress recognized Bob Elliott for his efforts in magic and the San Diego County Board of Supervisors made July 22nd Bob Elliott Day. Magic Book Review by Dr. Joel Moskowitz



A Review of

THE AMAZING



We live in an era where we are ever reproducing our history. Consider the millions of digital photos and media dissemination devices: Internet/You Tube/My Space, etc. Imagine an archeologist from some other planet happening onto Earth, the myriad evidences of our existence would doubtless drown their investigations in details. Conversely, stories from our past are lost, hidden, or unrecognized as to significance.

Who has not fantasized about stumbling on a Picasso at a garage sale? Wandered dusty used book shelves hoping to stumble on a signed first edition of a book by Houdini? Author Sandra Evans and her husband having completed mortgage payments on their 200 year old former coach house noticed that "The Amazing Chang" had owned the house for forty years (1919-1960). This was the beginning of Ms. Evans personal crusade of research into his career.

Not an aficionado of conjuring per se (she has been a big band vocalist/musician since 1968) anything 'show business' fascinated her. The reader of her superb investigative work, "The Amazing Chang" published by the author, February 2006, printed by TW Printing Associates Limited, Royal Leamington Spa pp 176 will be rewarded by the story, the artful illustrations, photographs, reference citations.

Samuel Lewis Webster Whittington – Wickes M.I.M.C. (1893-1970) may have had to change his name to Chang (The English name being too long and atheatrical). He

had several pseudonyms: Seekhett, as a youth; later Cellsus, The White Wizard and ultimately Chang. Ten name changes or more in his lifetime!

With the tenacity of a CSI detective, Ms. Evans interviewed citizens of the locality where Chang was born and lived and researched local records. She presents the reader with the tapestry of the formation of a world class illusionist. Inspired by Servais Leroy, also a runaway as was young Chang, he later admired the style of Chung Ling Soo and Dante. But he created his own effects. He was, suggests Evans, the Harry Potter of his time. "The Boy Magician" metamorphosized when he changed, for a brief time, his name to Vern-Lewis. The Lewis was his second name. Ms. Evans doesn't have an explanation for "Vern." Could it have been Dai Vernon? Another name change, following his service in World War I, from Paul Vernon was announced in The Magic Circular to thenceforth to be "Cellcus, The White Wizard," aka Vernon Cellcus.

This scion of a wealthy timber family fell to a butcher's daughter. Freda, his bride, was interested in palmistry. Did she read good omens in their life lines? The couple united matrimonially and professionally. Continuing his development, Chang, benefited from being the protege of Chris Van Bern (Life Member of the Inner Magic Circle and President of the Society for the Investigation of Psychic Happenings). Other models for his performance were Hyman Goldstein (stage name: Horace Goldin) a Polish Jew and Chung Ling Soo (a Scotsman from Brooklyn).

Compliments also are in order for the art work. The text is adorned with colorful reproductions of not only Chang's advertisements but that of Horace Goldin, and Chung Ling Soo, as well as Leroy, Talma and Bosco, Chang's agents. Photos of the locality where Chang was born and lived are pleasurable as well.


Ms. Evans writes that this talented illusionist/entertainer had other interests: He was accomplished at the violin and piano and was gifted in the repair of and restoration of musical instruments. He included Charlie Chaplin as a personal friend, as well as J.B. Priestley. The latter's novel "Lost Empires" featured a stage magician (the technical details, it may be inferred, were provided by Chang).

Chang's son, David Wickes, has followed in his father's love of stage. He is an award winning Golden Globe film director/screen writer. He is famed for directing many BBC television series and numerous cinema box office hits. He has acclaimed Ms. Evan's biography of his father which he asserts has captured his father's personality perfectly.

"Sandie" describes herself as a 'novice author' not much interested in history during her own schooling. These self-descriptions no longer apply.

She has proven her diligence at investigating a colorful master of the art of prestidigitation. Her literary efforts are no simple Internet harvesting. Rather she employed interpersonal interviewing combined with persistence. The leavening factor in this biography is the author's love for the history of a class performer by someone who herself is a star of theater. Albeit her specialty is song. "The Amazing Chang" is a lyric chronicle and is highly recommended.

Ring 76 member, Marcus Day Dead at 61

As many of you know, Marcus Day, a longtime member of Ring 76, had been receiving treatment for cancer for nearly a year. Marcus received word from his doctors in early May that the treatments were no longer effective in battling the fast moving disease. He went to Texas to visit his 95 year old mother in early June, and shortly after his arrival there, he was placed in a rest home for treatment of his weakened condition. Marcus died at the rest home on July 5th, he was 61.

His longtime friend and business partner in used magic books, J.P. Jackson, has written a moving tribute to his buddy Marcus Day. That tribute follows:

Marcus Day, of San Diego, California, died July 5, 2007, of cancer. He held I.B. M. # 43836R and was a long-time member of the Honest Sid Gerhart Ring 76, in San Diego. He was also a member of the Magic Collector's Association and the L.A. Conference on Magic History.

Educated at the University of Texas, Austin, as an Engineer, he later earned a Law Degree from the University of San Diego. He specialized in construction litigation and had a very significant part in the recent rewriting of Ring 76s Constitution and By-Laws.

As a young boy in Longview, Texas, he was captivated by watching a performance by Willard the Wizard, at his school and later, even more influenced by seeing Bill SIROS, perform his fabled open-air, floating lady illusion in the street of Longview. He often chuckled about how his mother let him skip school to see the full SIROS magic show.

His magic interests were rekindled when he went home to Texas and found a beat-up copy of: *The Boys Book of Magic*, in his old bedroom bookcase. He rapidly became an avid and knowledgeable magic bibliophile. He specialized in historical and biographical books and antiquarian "How-To" books with especially, attractive pictorial covers.

He met his long-time magic friend and business partner at the magic shelf of a used book store in San Diego, in 1987, and joined the I.B.M. in 1988. He attended his first Magic Collector's Weekend in the spring of 1989, and his life was never quite the same.

He was also a drag racing and NASCAR enthusiast and regularly attended racing events and car shows in Southern California. At the time of his death he was carefully restoring his 1966, Plymouth Satellite.

Marcus Day is survived by his wife of 35 years, his mother who is (95), and a brother. He was my pal, business partner, convention roommate, advisor, mentor in many things and most of all he was my friend. **J.P. Jackson**

and they need more parking for their guests.


