J.P. Jackson and Jack White will give Ring members a little magic history lesson this year as they recreate the famous "Spirit Painting" illusion that was often a part of the now almost forgotten midnight spook shows that toured this country in the 1930s, 40s and 50s. The spirit painting effect that J.P. and Jack will be presenting was designed by the great Paul Fox and was used by several famous magicians of the past.

You have time to pull some props out of your magic trunk and clean them up and work out your favorite Halloween routine for this months meeting. If you are a close-up worker there is always time to work out a close-up routine to present before or after the regular meeting. Ask Jack White to show you his famous "Spirit Lock" effect. It is a close-up classic that is perfect for the Halloween season.

These are always fun meetings and a time to be creative with your old magic effects so dig out some of your older magic and have some fun with it and show it off at our October meeting. Ring 76 Public Show Canceled

After more than a month of negotiations with the Carlsbad business community and Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce CEO Ted Owen, Ring 76 President Terry Lunceford has decided to cancel plans for a public show scheduled for October 18th & 19th at the Carlsbad Village Theater. Lunceford believes that moving the show to a period during the spring of 2009 will work better for the Ring and for securing financing of the show itself.

Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce CEO Ted Owen had been working with several prominent North County business representatives to purchase all of the tickets for the shows and give them to a charity to sell. In light of the current economic slowdown it has been more difficult to find investors. Several people have expressed interest in such a deal but would like to push the show back a few months, hoping for a better economy.

Ring President Lunceford has investigated the possibility of several other venues for presenting a Ring 76-sponsored show in other North County communities and in San Diego. Theater size, rental costs and ticket sales are of major consideration. Since Ring 76 and its members are not equipped to sell tickets for such an event, a necessary fact of life for the show to be a success is that a second party is able to purchase a large block of tickets or all of the tickets to help pay for the rental of the hall, insurance and other incidentals that go with the production of such a show.

Lunceford said, "The Halloween season is the perfect time to present a magic show of the kind we were want to present. However, we started a little late in our planning for financing the show and the recent downturn on Wall Street has not helped in pulling money together for our event." President Lunceford added, "It would be fiscally irresponsible to attempt such a show without the help of outside money to pay the expenses."

"Continuation of work with those interested in helping Ring 76 produce a show will assure a successful event for the future," said President Lunceford. So Terry and the board are working on the financial side of producing a public

The Deception of a Magician Review by Joel A. Moskowitz M.D August 28, 2008

Sic Transit Gloria Mundi (So passes the glory of the world). It has been but only eight years since the magician who is attributed with having given a facelift to magic has passed on. This illusionist is credited with having stimulated renewed interest in conjuring. He, whose fame soared to heights exceeding prior levitations, vanished. The name, Doug Henning, is seldom mentioned these days.

What happened? This Canadian illusionist rejected the stereotype of the top-hatted, tuxedo-wearing mystifier. His hair was long, smile effervescent, clothes casual and flamboyant. He flitted about the stage like a butterfly creating wonder and receiving awards.

Martin Gardner, science genius and enthusiastic magic hobbyist, addresses the self-deception and ultimate disappearance of Henning in a chapter of his book. The title: "Weird Water and Fuzzy Logic", 260pp published by Prometheus Books, Amherst, New York. Among many extraordinary subjects e.g. Eyeless Vision and God and Klingon and other Artificial Languages, 16 essays originally published in Skeptical Inquirer, is "Doug Henning and the Giggling Guru".

Gardner, while listing Henning's triumphs — e.g. a magic show which ran on Broadway for four years, numerous television spectaculars and multiple other appearances writes, "Then something happened to Doug on his way to a magic shop. He discovered TM (Transcendental Meditation) and became a pal of the founder".


By repeating a 'mantra' and forking over thousands of dollars, TM promises that you will develop the ability to become invisible, to see hidden things, to walk through walls and fly through the air; real magic, not stage stuff. Henning swallowed this. He is said to have asserted: 'thinking so' would allow you to 'levitate'. You, Henning counseled, once having achieved a high state of consciousness would be able to become invisible because your body "just stops reflecting light."

Henning was so imbued with the potential of TM that he abandoned his career, selling his effects to David Copperfield and others. He planned a center where the marvels would be demonstrated. This billion dollar extravaganza would utilize extreme technology to astound visitors. He intended to include many of his magic illusion

secrets. The paradox of his belief that Transcendental Meditation was valid yet his willingness to present trickery in the service of advertising TM is notable.

No source that this reviewer has consulted implies that Henning was a charlatan. He was a believer. Sadly, the health benefits attributed to TM didn't work for him - he died at age 52, in 2000 of liver cancer. This may be a testimony to the mystery of self-deception. It is generally thought that the hyper-educated such as university professors are prone to be deceived. How is it that a master of deception, such as Doug Henning, fell prey to the false promise of TM?

Martin Gardner is a lucid author whose topics describe worldwide irrationality. He provides the antidote: informed writing. This book is highly recommended for thinking magicians and other life forms.




