# January Teach-in Meeting Brings Out The Best

49 members and guests were at the January 12th meeting with the spotlight on a five-member teach-in team. Bob Ingalls, Tom McCarthy, Jeff Pearson, Michael E. Johnson and Syd Segal rotated among the five tables of eight magic enthusiasts each offering routines ranging from simple to intermediate-level skills and lasting not more than 10 minutes in presentation time.

Bob Ingalls, a last minute substitute for Loch David Crane who had taken ill earlier, showed the group Mark Wilson's 3-Way test, a one-ahead impromptu form of Mental Epic using slips of paper & a pencil, a container (coffee cup) and a few available objects at hand. Tom McCarthy's That's an Odd Color by Chaz the Magician was the center-

piece of his demonstration, his other stunner being a four Kings trick which allowed Tom to teach the Elmsley count, a necessity for any card worker.

Dr. Jeff Pearson gave the students Eddie Fechter's That's It utilizing the center peek. Michael E. Johnson revealed his famed Sponge Rabbits routine, a show stopper wherever he appears, and Syd Segal showed how to do a four ace production. Lucky random winners of a question Syd would pose to each group won a DVD of his new release Simply Sydney, a fine teaching tool for serious card workers.

This year's teach-in was well appreciated by all who attended and it encouraged a few guests to join on the spot!

# Magic Book

Want to Never Get Invited Again and Never Be Forgotten? Review of "Stuntology" by Sam Bartlett by Joel A. Moskowitz M.D October 13, 2008

Obnoxious, Annoying, Gastly, Unbelievable, Jerk, Painful, Ridiculous, Freaky, Disgusting, Crazy, Confounding, Sickening, Just plain NUTS! According to Wikitionary, a free dictionary, "Stuntology" is a neologism coined by Sam Bartlett in the 1980s and trademarked by him in 2002. It is defined as "The study of unorthodox and resourceful techniques employed by people to avoid boredom in all situations. A body of knowledge that includes the perfection of meaningless techniques (such as straw-popping or hand shadows), odd physical sensations (such as the playground simulation, "dead man's finger"), pointless games (such as "cheek darts"), as well as simple pranks against friends and social institutions.


Sam Bartlett must thrill and bewilder his psychiatrist. Bartlett is a musician with too much time on his hands. On the road, he has collected his personal antidote to boredom. Why would anyone want to know and show how to open a bottle with your eye socket? To gross out your friends" (soon to become enemies?). Wouldn't you like to automate your computer to announce "Sam Bartlett (substitute your name) is not in his office right now. He will be back November 08, 2016." Or, if you ever get invited to a party and they have balloons, Bartlett instructs to surreptitiously pour some lemon juice on each of them (always carry a bottle of lemon juice with you) and Bartlett, the scientist, insists that the lemon juice will eat through the rubber and the balloons will explode. Or..answer telemarketers by tucking your tongue behind your lower teeth. Your unintelligible utterances will frustrate the solicitor.

Why would followers of magic want to own/read/use anything in Stuntology? Revenge? When your host keeps you waiting and then pays you less than agreed? Use his/her bathroom and covertly unscrew the shower head - insert a bouillon cube - reassemble and delight in the anticipation that the deadbeat will smell like a roast beef after showering! Or, use a safety pin to punch a few tiny holes a half inch or so from the lip of the styrofoam cups. Voila! Instant dribble 'glass'!

Is there anything in this book which won't trigger a lynching party with you as the main event? Can these nasty maneuvers be used to enhance your performance of mystery and legerdemain? Somewhat. For example: "Fork Telekenesis" is an instant way to levitate a fork behind a napkin (p52) aka Zombie. With the "Grinning Jackson

Stunt" Bartlett teaches you to fold a \$20 dollar bill so that you can change the expression on the President's smile (p69). Do pseudo hypnosis by asking a spectator sitting in a chair with both feet on the ground to lift up their right foot and move it in a clockwise circle. While doing this, raise and extend their right hand and draw the number 6. Their foot will change direction. Tell them they are in your control (Weird Neurological Stunt - p159). You can fake having a toothpick jabbed completely through your index finger (p195).

This collection of 304 pranks, tricks & challenges is illustrated (cartoons) by the author himself, all in 327 pages of a softbound publication of Workman Publishing, New York (About \$10.00). If nothing else, fantasizing victimizing some deserving acquaintance with some of this devilishly evil nastinesses might give you hours of mental pleasure.
