## Broken Wand Jim Riley

1950-2010

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Lifetime Ring 76 Member, Jim Riley. Jim joined

Ring 76 in 1966 at the age of 16. Over the years, Jim has served on the Board, been an associate editor of the newsletter and served as Ring President. Jim was a member of the steering that brought the 1979 IBM Convention to San Diego. Jim was a member of the Order of Merlin. In 2006, Ring 76 honored Jim with a Lifetime Achievement award.

Jim grew up in San Diego; his first exposure to magic

was watching a pitchman doing the Svengali Deck at the fair in Del Mar. When he was in the 6th grade he met a man named Gordon Plummer who was a teacher, writer, scientist, musician and magician. Gordon became Jim's mentor in magic and a lifelong friend.

In the early 1960's, Jim worked as a demonstrator, on weekends and holidays at "The Fun Shop". This was located at Third and C streets just behind the California Theater. The Fun Shop sold gags and novelties in the front and in the back room, magic was sold.

career that was to last over 40 years. Jim retired from teaching in 2001. Jim was also active outside of the schools in working with young people. For many years, Jim worked with the Junior magician's program at Ring 76 and he helped to produced the annual Ring 76 Junior Magician's contest. Jim would teach his students the imporpatter to go with their tricks.

After graduating from college, Jim started a teaching

Jim also found time for charity work. During the Vietnam War, Jim often volunteered at the Navy Hospital in Balboa Park. In 2006, Jim completed over 700 hours of volunteer work for patients and their parents at Children's Hospital in San



#### Mischief

#### Radical Hypnosis & Mind-Control

Why do you need this book? As a Forensic Psychiatrist it amused me to have a sign posted amongst my diplomas and credentials "Of course I know what you are thinking and you should be ashamed of yourself!" My mental health training and membership in Psychic Entertainers Association enhanced my experience to observe the tells of people.

The ability of those who describe themselves as Psychics: performers and charlatans; or Hypnotists: therapists and entertainers depend on being able to read subtle mannerisms. A clever television series, "Lie To Me" is based upon the usefulness of micro-expression detection in penetrating

the masks of criminals and mentally disturbed or disturbing individuals and just plain folk. I am pleased to recommend a book that will enhance your ability to 'bend men's (and women's) minds.

The art of 'reading people' has benefits in social and business situations. For those who pretend to read or manipulate minds such talents are imperative. "Mischief", a veritable textbook, whose subtitle is "Radical Hypnosis and Mind-Control" should be of interest to all devotees of the conjuring arts. This softbound 438 page book, published in Denmark but happily available (by dealers) from Murphy's Magic Supplies (check with your favorite dealer for pricing - circa \$70.00)

Who are Harling & Nyrup? Martin Nyrup is a certified NLP (Neurolinguistic Programming) 'Business Practitioner' with a keen interest in mentalism. In two companies which he owns, he successfully applies NLP and hypnotic methods to manage day to day activities. Ian Harling is said to have explored and performed hypnosis and 'other devious forms of trickery for over 40 years. Passionate about the paranormal and the mysterious he roams the world in search of enhancing his appreciation of the possibilities of suggestion.

Martin and Ian had previously published "Sleight of Mind" and "Geist" which were acclaimed by mentalists especially

those interested in NLP. This new production includes revision of their earlier work plus a hundred additional sheets of new material. The latter includes a smorgasbord of effects and tricks which might be a tad too complex but the methods deserve study. When people think of 'mischief' they think or practical jokes but more current definitions are less bland. Parallel might be



hacker mischief with invasion of privacy and dire consequences. To be able to read another's mind is in a sense an invasion of privacy. Hence "mischief" is appropriate.

Harling & Nyrup describe tools to diagnose facial and bodily movements. They also address the elements of hypnosis. Hypnotism, the authors explain, includes

attention to tone of voice, pacing, as well as methods to determine susceptibility. Maneuvers to avoid resistance, to create expectation melded with confidence in delivery, and good scripting are essentials for the master hypnotist. Suggestions which are clear, unambiguous and not too subtle, layered with rapport leavened with an aim to get the audience to like you are key to success.

The authors provide historical insights. For example: Emile Coue' at the turn of the 19th century also known as the Father of Self Conditioning and the Prophet of Self Suggestion (auto-suggestion) His lessons are still valid today. Positive effects e.g. vs. addiction and phobias, for instance, are

capable of being used against society Public deception e.g. in occult 'science's employ some of the same psychological principles. Those familiar with Theosophy (Madame Blavatsky) may the correlation described by Harling & Nyrup.

That said, the text is replete with concepts that some finger flickers care will not care about. But if their aim is to truly understand and master the art (not only of psychic marvels and hypnotism) but the psychology of maximizing wonder, this book is for you. It is most highly respected and recommended. Rx Rx Rx Rx (5/5)
