#### **BEHIND THE SCENES**



A brief look at members' contributions to the success of the Ring, professional backgrounds and other interests.

Raul Rivera Melo Madera, better known to Ring 76 members and his audiences as "Mago Ruly," was born in Mexico City and now resides in Tijuana.



He has performed his unique style of magic for 45 years and particularly likes performing close up magic, children's magic and adult comedy magic. He has been a member of I.B.M. Ring 76 for over ten years and has won both Stage and Close-Up competitions as well as being awarded Entertainer of the Year for 2010- 2011. He currently serves on the Board as Member-at-Large,

While in Mexico City, he belonged to the Association of Latin-American Illusionists. He created the International Festival of Magic in Tijuana in 1998 and continues to be involved in the event.

But Raul's involvement in show business goes far beyond magic. He is an actor, having attended the National Institute of Fine Arts where he performed in theatrical productions and received the title of Theater Instructor in 1978.

He is an accomplished ventriloquist, puppeteer and musician. He has performed as singer and guitarist for restaurants and bars in different cities throughout Mexico including Ensenada, Mexicali, Tijuana, Acapulco, Guadalajara, Merida, Cuernavaca and many others. For more than 5 years, he worked in Center Nocturne, opening the show for other Mexican artists.

He has written music for commercial radio and TV and produced a 5-disc album of his music for children and adults.

For over 30 years, Raul worked in radio and television doing magic in various television

programs next to several different international artists. He has more than 25 years experience as a Voice Actor in TV series including the Lassie show in 1970.

He has done commercials for different advertising agencies and production companies, receiving the "Luis M. Farias" medal from the National Broadcasters of Mexico for 25 years of service

Throughout his artistic career, he has had many corporate clients including Coca Cola, Burger King, Kellogg, Nestle, Wendys, Panasonic, Walmart, Peter Piper Pizza, and Banati.

When he's not performing, Raul enjoys cooking ethnic food including Japanese, Italian, Arabic and, of course, Mexican!

He is the proud father of two children, his daughter Liye who is a singer, and his son Raul who plays several instruments. They often perform with their father and have entertained the Ring on numerous occasions.

Raul has a Masters Degree in Human Development with a special interest in Child Development, conducting courses in self-improvement for children. For 20 years he has lead a program called "Leading child" for young children and a program called "Leader" for young teens within the Hispanic communities in different cities of Mexico

#### A MAGICIAN IS POWERFUL!

**DO** I have any *right* to put my opinions down on paper? **DO** I have the *credibility* for this to be something others might consider? Can Donald Trump Run for President of the United States?

A true **Magician**, as opposed to a person who performs tricks, is a powerful person. He or she is capable of drawing strong and durable emotions from their audience. Most of all, the Magician can control the audience's perception of reality.

Wouldn't you like to be a Magician?

Why do you go through the motions of being a Magician anyway? Do you like to fool people? Do you like being the center of attention? Do you like creating an alternate reality for audiences to witness, marvel at and believe in? Do you want to impress the opposite sex? (I thought so).

When we work hard to go beyond the level of what Jeff MacBride calls "the Trickster" and move into the realm of being a Magician, we can create a moment for our audience that suspends them in time, takes them out of their everyday life experience and places them in the "reality" we are creating for them.

Most of the time, the reality we are creating for them is a simple "WHOA! How did you do that?" or a good laugh along with the surprise. We mesmerize and entertain and transport our audience into a place of our creation. That creation can be more than laughter and wonder — so we better work hard at creating that place because the real power of a Magician is to create a different reality *that moves us*.

In our journey to becoming powerful Magicians, we have many tools available to us including:

Scripting
Practice/Rehearsal/Production
Our Stage Persona
Acting/Blocking/Direction
Collaboration with others

From my limited experience, the catalyst which enables a truly powerful Magician to alter

peoples' reality is not something I can force or make happen. It is something that happens when I am prepared and the circumstances are right. Some true examples are:

It was a holiday party for a small company at Guadalajara's in Old Town. I was strolling before the meal and did a set after their meal. The material wasn't getting the reactions I was used to. I was getting worried that this was a disaster in the making; Everyone was so...so...blah!

When I approached the CEO after my performance to get paid, I said I was sorry my performance was so lackluster and he could reduce my fee if he thought it appropriate. He smiled and put his hand on my shoulder and said "No, no, you were great! You see, everyone is really depressed and we almost cancelled the event because our favorite receptionist just passed away from brain cancer a few weeks ago and we are all in the dumps. You actually got our spirits up and I want to thank you!" Tip on top of fee!

I was hired to stroll for an hour at an upscale wedding reception in the U.S. Grant Hotel lobby. There were local FOX News celebrities, and many "beautiful people." I was having fun and doing well when I noticed a pretty young lady in her early 20s sitting in a wheelchair with her leg in a cast at the edge of the crowd. She had been placed next to a couch of sleeping seniors and looked miserable. "Hi, do you like magic?" I asked. "YES!" was her reply and so I started to entertain her but got volunteers from the crowd – mostly handsome young men. By the time I was finished, she was chatting with three boys and looking much happier. My job here was done. We can be powerful Magicians, not just persons who do tricks. We can make a big difference in some people's lives. We need to be prepared, ready, attentive, and always striving to create strong magic and strong emotional responses in our audience.

And, yes, it's a great way to meet girls.
