


What's Coming Up!

Important Change in Meeting Parking. Please Pay Attention

Fellow members Your Board of Directors needs your help and cooperation, please! Due to an increase in the number of priests who are living at the Church, we have been instructed that the ONLY available parking spaces in the little gated parking lot at the Church are the five spaces on the SOUTH-WEST side of the parking lot, plus a SINGLE space near the recreation hall door. Two of those spaces (the one near the rec hall door and the one farthest from the door) are reserved for our Librarian and our VP of Entertainment.


In consideration of our members with mobility issues, your Board has voted that the remaining four spaces be designated Handicap Only, available on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE basis. Any member parking in one of those four spaces must display a Handicap Placard or have Handicap

plates on their vehicle.

Please see the attached photo. It's okay to park in the BLUE Handicap area *if* you have a valid Handicap permit. At NO time should you park in the RED area. There is to be no parking in the YELLOW area either (no double parking!).

We understand that, at times, members will need to unload/load their equipment near the door. The spot immediately in front of where our Librarian parks (small BLUE rectangle) is the ONLY unloading/loading spot. You may park there for only as long as it takes to unload/load. Please DO NOT leave your vehicle parked there while you set up your equipment. Please unload your equipment as quickly as possible and then move your vehicle to the street or city parking lot BEFORE you start setting up your equipment.

The important part of this is to NEVER inconvenience the priests who live there. We are VERY lucky to have this meeting spot available to us. Compared to the our previous meeting location, the Ring is saving over \$1,000 per year in meeting location costs. That's money we can put toward the ever-increasing costs of lecturers and paid entertainers (Installation Banquet and Holiday Party).







Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury.

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and magazines, all available for check-out. It is 540 magic audiobooks, 1,688 magic instruction videos, 86 full length magic movies, 8 albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,481 magic performance videos (many classics), 10 podcasts (over 2,000 episodes we co-host), 23 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the *Ring 76 Magic Media Server*.

It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fund-raising efforts that I have engage in for your behalf."

We made \$31 from the 50/50 Opportunity Drawing, \$70 from the Door Prize Drawing, and \$0.00 from Library Sales at the June meeting. We made three purchases for \$39.73 leaving the library Petty Cash at \$318.56.

We have other things to purchase for the library but I am holding off until the cash balance increases and am only focusing on essentials at this time. The library needs to be fed in order to keep it alive so your donations would be greatly appreciated.

Ring 76 Magical Arts Library (Books)

We did not purchase any printed books this month but have received several boxes from donations that will be inventoried and put into circulation.


Ring 76 Magic Media Server (Streaming Service)

Server activity is down this month probable due to the nice weather in San Diego. New items are: the 76 magic themed audiobooks that were donated, 2 magic audiobooks that we purchased, the 53 magic DVDs that were donated and the 1 magic movie we purchased. This brings our magic audiobooks collection up to 540, our magic instruction videos (not digitized yet) up to 1,688, and our magic movies up to 86. Not everything has been put on the server yet but is in process.

Side-note for those who want to know; I work on the server almost every day for 1-4 hours a day searching for and adding material as well as doing admin and maintenance work. Volunteers are always welcome.

Plex only offers 4 categories:

- Movie Category in green (Magic Instruction (1,606), Magic Movies (85), & Magic Performances (1,481)
- TV Category in red (Magic TV Shows (23))
- Music Category in blue (Magic Audiobooks (465), Magic Music (8), & Magic Podcasts (10 for over 2,000 episodes)
- Photos Category in orange (Ring 76 Photos and Videos)

by Harry Lorayne


Harry Lorayne was an American mnemonist, magician, and author. He was well known for his incredible memory demonstrations and appeared on numerous television shows. His card magic,

The Magic of Marie Laveau

The life and work of the legendary "Pope of Voodoo," Marie Laveau—a free woman of color who practically ruled New Orleans in the mid-1800s Marie Laveau may be the most influential American practitioner of the magical arts; certainly, she is among the most famous. She is the subject of songs, films, and legends and the star of New Orleans ghost tours. Her grave in New Orleans ranks among the most popular spiritual pilgrimages in the US. Devotees venerate votive images of Laveau, who proclaimed




herself the "Pope of Voodoo." She is the subject of respected historical biographies and the inspiration for novels by Francine Prose and Jewell Parker Rhodes. She even appears in Marvel Comics and on the television show American Horror Coven, where she was portrayed by Angela Bassett. Author Denise Alvarado explores Marie Laveau's life and work—the fascinating history and mystery. This book gives an overview of New Orleans Voodoo, its origins, history, and practices. It contains spells, prayers, rituals, recipes, and instructions for con-

structing New Orleans voodoo-style altars and crafting a voodoo amulet known as a gris-gris.

Showmanship for Magicians

by Dariel Fitzkee

Showmanship for Magicians is a 1943 work by semi-professional magician and author Dariel Fitzkee. It is the first in the Fitzkee Trilogy, a classic collection that is still read widely by magicians, conjurors, and illusionists alike. There is little information available on the life of Dariel Fitzkee outside of his written work. Born in Annawan, Illinois, in 1898 as Dariel Comp Fitzkee, he later changed his surname to Fitzroy during World War II. But he continued to write under the name Fitzkee throughout his life. Fitzkee's early books were shorter works focused on specific magic tricks. Books like Cut and Restored Rope and Manipulation (1929) and Linking Ring Manipulation (1930) described multiple variations of these classic tricks.




Fitzkee was also a regular contributor to Genii Magazine, which is still published today. He wrote two recurring magic columns in the 1930s called "Thoughts are Things" and "Glimpses of Strange Shadows." Fitzkee also contributed a book and magazine review column called "Paper and Ink" that ran for over 12 years. Many magicians throughout the second half of the 20th century have considered *Showmanship for Magicians* to be a cornerstone work in the field, including the actor Steve

Martin who was fanatical about magic as a young man. He described the book as "...more important to me than *The Catcher in the Rye*."


Fitzkee was frustrated with the quality of magic at the time of his writing. One of his biggest issues with magic in the 1940s was that its performers were still treating the trappings of the late 1800s as the "standard" for magic. Performers often dressed in out-of-date tuxedos, wearing top hats or turbans. Fitzkee felt that magic should be "...geared and attuned to the times" to keep it fresh and interesting for the audience.

MAGIC MOVIE REVIEWS (on the Magic Media

The American Society of Magical Negroes 2024 (satire/comedy)

For some of us, "American Fiction" has a satirical audacity that's funny right out of the gate, gathers speed and force on the runway — and then, somehow, just when the comedy should be taking off, it turns muted

and moralistic instead. I think the hitch is that after Jeffrey Wright's Monk sells his fake memoir of Black street life, there's a strong urge to see him — and the film — take a certain vengeful joy in how the book's popularity skewers the racism of clueless white people. Instead, Monk is made so miserable by what happens that the movie never allows itself to discover that joy

Had it done so, it might have been more like "The American Society of Magical Negroes," a comedy of racial images that's every bit as witty and scandalous as "American Fiction" (it almost feels like a kind of cousin to Cord Jefferson's film), only this one follows through on the outrage. The writer-director, Kobi Libii, wants to make us laugh and twist our heads at the same time. He brings it off. "The American Society of Magical Negroes" is a deftly observant fantasy comedy that stays true to its own irreverence.



- K. I PLEDGE THAT I WILL NEVER TRY TO OUT-DUEL A FELLOW PERFORMER JUST FOR THE SAKE OF DOING SO.
- L. I PLEDGE THAT I WILL NEVER ASSUME THAT ANYTHING IN A FELLOW PERFORMERS ACT IS IN THE MAGIC DOMAIN FOR ME TO TAKE, THIS INCLUDES EFFECTS, SUBTLETIES AND LINES.
- M. I PLEDGE THAT I FULLY UNDERSTAND THAT JUST BECAUSE I AM A FELLOW MAGI THAT DOES NOT GIVE

 ME THE RIGHT TO ALL AND ANY SECRETS OF OTHER MAGICIANS. IF I ASK FOR PERMISSION FOR THE SECRET

 OR USE OF AN EFFECT FROM A FELLOW MAGICIAN, I AM WELL AWARE AND ACCEPT THEY HAVE A RIGHT TO

 KEEP THE SECRET FOR THEMSELVES AND IT IS NOT PERSONAL BUT BUSINESS.
- N. I PLEDGE I WILL NEVER TOUCH ANOTHER PERFORMERS PROPS WITHOUT PERMISSION.
- I FULLY UNDERSTAND THAT I WILL SUSPENDED FROM THIS CLUB AND ANY MAGIC SOCIETY IF

 I AM FOUND BREAKING ANY OF THESE PLEDGES.
- I FULLY UNDERSTAND THAT AS A FELLOW MAGICIAN I HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY TO PROMOTE A POSTIIVE ATTITUDE TOWARDS THE MAGIC CRAFT AS A WHOLE.
