First up was **Ms. Charlie** who called up volunteer Paula Derring and took a deck of cards, giving her half. She chose a card and slid it into Charlie's deck. When the deck was fanned, two cards were indeed turned over, the chosen cards. A cold chill ran down the backs of all the witnesses.



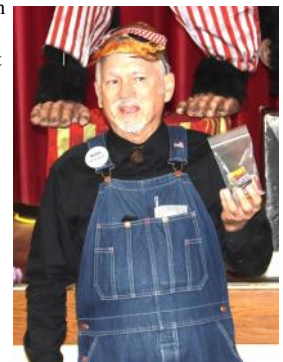
The magic of **Mark Booth** was next. He randomly picked two members of the audience by having a skull head passed until someone said STOP. Jordan, a visitor came up to aid "Mental Mark." Trick AND Treat was the name of the effect and two glasses were shown, one containing a treat and the other an even better one. In the end, only one treat remained and that went to "Mental Mark." Jordan walked away with See's Candy.



Next up was **Callahan** who started in a skeleton mask and spoke Spanish. He told the story of a witch on the street who gave him a coin. He told her he was the master of the cheap truck and proceeded to produce silks and perform impressive silk magic.



"**Max with an X**" was next and showed up with his overalls and told the story of going to the supermarket and using a twenty dollar bill to get a big bag of candy and five dollars in change. He said he would magically produce candy for those who said "trick or treat," and give a sandwich to those who did not. Soon there appeared a hag who said, "Give me a treat or I'll make a scene." She took ropes and encased her neck and said give me money or I'll choke myself. Max declared that he gave her three of his dollars and the rope melted through her neck, as he demonstrated. She gave him a key to a haunted house that spun in his hand but when the hag disappeared with the key, Max still had his \$5 in cash.



After that was **Michael Johnson** who opened with jazz music and presented a modified "geek show" which was popular in carnivals in years gone by. He pulled out two poles each with a light. He stung a string between the poles and tied a silk to the string. He leaned in and passed the string through his neck. He then took a knife and seemed to cut his finger which he passed through his chin. He then cut his arm deep with the knife though no blood flowed. Finally, he passed a straw into his neck and drank water from a bottle.

Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 Library in San Diego, CA.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "*Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury*" is on all my personal books.

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "*What is the Ring 76 Library?*" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and magazines, all available for check-out. It is 630 magic audiobooks, 1,688 magic instruction videos, 86 full length magic movies, 8 albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,481 magic performance videos (many classics), 10 podcasts (over 2,000 episodes we that co-host), 23 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the *Ring 76 Magic Media Server*."

It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fundraising efforts that I have engage in for your behalf."

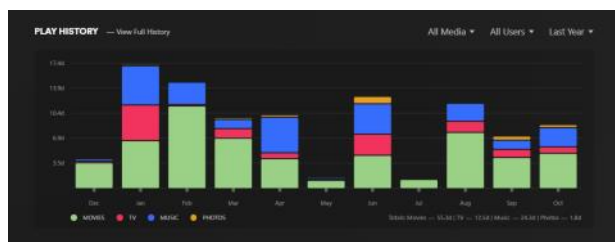

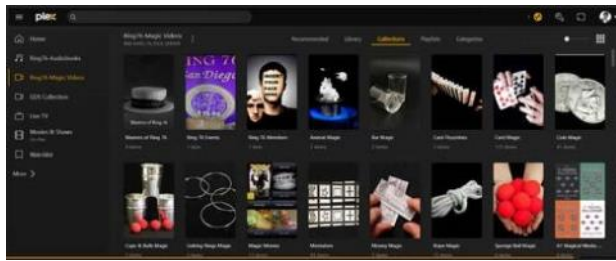
Plex only offers four categories for our eight separate libraries:

I will make sure the item(s) get to the next monthly meeting or you can pick it up at my home in Blossom Valley.

There is a limit of 4 items per month. You will need to sign the library card attached to the item along with your phone number. We ask that you return the items to the library on or before the monthly meeting for the following month (for example: If you check out a book at the July meeting, it should be returned on or before the August meeting). If need be, you can keep the book or video again if nobody else has requested it but you must sign for it again.

Staying Calm Before and During a Show

Many people ask me how I stay calm before and during a show. The truth is, I am not always calm. One way I know I am getting revved up for a performance is that I begin stepping on toes of the people closest to me - literally. Assistants know to watch my feet just before showtime as I tend to be only partially in my body, as they put it, until I get out there.

There are a few common things that help which most people know. Knowing what you are doing, true rehearsal, helps calm nerves. You bore yourself silly in rehearsals so that the actual event seems like just one more time.

Another simple thing is breathing. We tend to forget to breathe when we get anxious. It is common for me to say to friends "BREATHE" anytime they are anxious, whether in performance or in life. When we catch ourselves feeling upset, usually our breathing is out of whack. Breathe in calm energy and breathe out anxiety. Sure it's simple, even sappy to some people, but try it for a little while and see for yourself.

Act calm and you tell your subconsciousness to be calm. You may think, "I am lying, I am not calm" but that doesn't matter. Act calm and your subconscious will soon get the message and start relaxing your mind and body.

Finally, it matters how you label life experience. If you feel "nervous" before a performance, large or small, you are going to be "nervous." However if you feel this feeling and call it what it is, "excitement" or "power", then you will be EXCITED and POWERFUL instead.

Bruce Springsteen has said that he doesn't get "butterflies in his stomach" before a performance. Instead he gets "excited." It's an important difference, and a simple choice.

The truth is you get excited because you want more energy available to you when you perform. It is a natural response. When you need more power available to you, your mind and body naturally begin making it available to you. People wrongly label this as "nerves" because they feel the energy pulsating through their nerves. But this is not "nervousness". Rather it is POWER being made available for your use.

Next time you find yourself feeling power pulsating through you, don't label it poorly. Call it what it is.

"I am making all the power I could ever need available to me now. I am being prepared with all the resources I need at any and every moment during my performance."

Because that's the truth. It's amazing that your subconscious brings all of this available to you without your having to demand it. The POWER is there automatically. Be in wonder at what your subconscious naturally gives to you so that you can do all that you need in any performance, be it a simple trick for friends or a full stage show.

You only get "nerves" if you mistake the power for the effect it has on your body. Feel the power pulsating through your nerves and know that you are being completely energized through every nerve and cell of your mind and body. Your subconscious is preparing you to have any and all the resources you need to be truly magical in your performance. It is being sure you have full access to POWER. That's what you are feeling.

It did not appear that it generated much interest and Ring 76 may not seem to be a subject of interest for them. Misha points out the feedback of the club is an important reason to be a member and we should look at helping people improve their skills but focusing on this. Several suggestions on how to do this were presented including holding "jam sessions" from 6-7 before the meeting. Magicians helping magicians.

It was decided to improve Bag Night by letting performers can pare up on one bag. It may be a way of presenting better magic with the surprised props.

With that the meeting was closed.



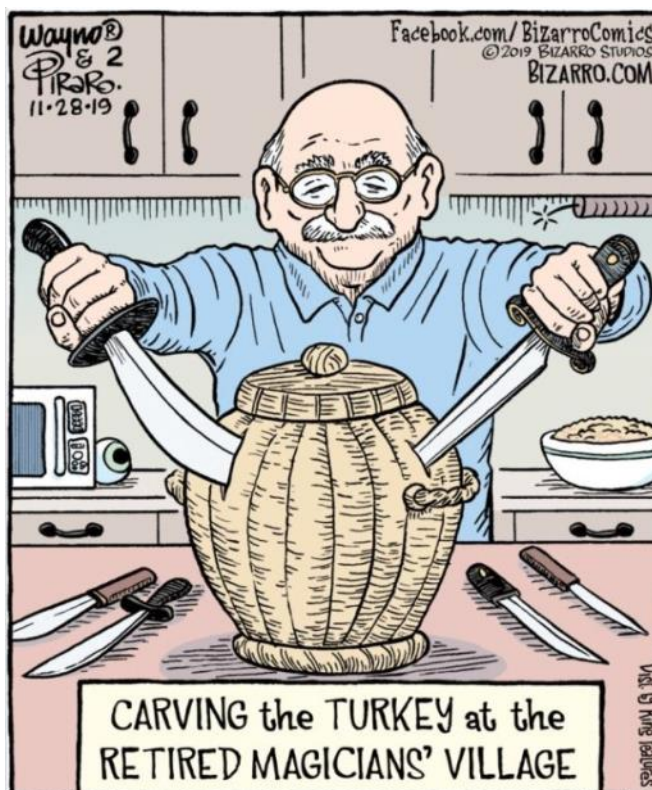


Good Resources on the Net

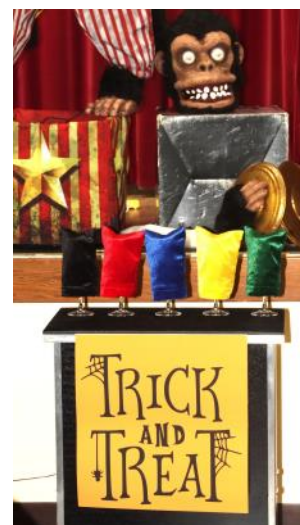

SAN DIEGO RING 76, INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD OF MAGICIANS



Joint I.B.M. and S.A.M. Ethics Statement

The International Brotherhood of Magicians and the Society of American Magicians join in recommending that all magicians adhere to the following code of ethical conduct

- Oppose the willful exposure to the public of any principles of the Art of Magic or the method employed in any magic effect or illusion.
- Display ethical behavior in the presentation of magic to the public and in our conduct as magicians, including not interfering with or jeopardizing the performance of another magician, either through personal intervention or the unauthorized use of another's creation.
- Recognize and respect for rights of the creators, inventors, authors and owners of magic concepts, presentations, effect and literature, and their rights to have exclusive use of, or to grant permission for the use of by others of such creations.
- Discourage false and misleading statements in the advertising of effects and literature merchandise or actions pertaining to the magical arts.
- Discourage advertisement in magical publication for any magical apparatus, effect, literature of other materials for which the advertiser does not have commercial rights.
- Promote the humane treatment and care of livestock used in magical performances.

Each organization expects its members to adhere to the foregoing ethical principles and to educate non-members to the need to adhere to these ethical precepts.
